

## **FACILITY DEFINITIONS**

### **Manufacturer:**

A person or entity, except a pharmacy, who prepares, derives, produces, researches, test, labels, or packages any drug medicine, chemical, or poison

### **Private Label Distributor:**

A firm that does not participate in the manufacture or processing of a drug, but instead markets and distributes under its own trade name, and labels a drug product made by someone else. A private label distributor is responsible for the products it introduces into interstate commerce and for compliance with federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act requirements and Current Good Manufacturing Practices regulations.

### **Repackager:**

A person who purchases or acquires from a manufacturer or distributor, a drug, medicine, chemical, or poison for the purpose of bottling, labeling, or otherwise repackaging for sale or distribution

### **Third-Party Logistics Provider:**

An entity that provides or coordinates warehousing or other logistics services of a product in interstate commerce on behalf of a manufacturer, wholesale distributor, or dispenser of a product, that does not take ownership of the product, nor have responsibility to direct the sale or disposition of the product.

### **Wholesale Distributor:**

A person other than a manufacturer, the co-licensed partner of a manufacturer, a third-party logistics provider, or a repackager, engaged in the business of distributing drugs and medicines for resale to pharmacies, hospitals, practitioners, government agencies, or other lawful outlets permitted to sell drugs or medicines
