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Policy 23-004

PHARMACIST INVOLVEMENT WITH MEDICAL CANNABIS

1. May a pharmacy also be a dispensary? The site desiring to be a dispensary shall follow all applicable Alabama Medical Cannabis Commission rules and regulations, specifically Chapter 538-X-8.

Ex: 538-X-8-.02(6)(d) states,

A licensed dispensary must comply with the following:

d. Dispense only medical cannabis provided through valid contracts with other (nondispensary) licensees and related products associated with medical cannabis, e.g., inhalers or other administration aids.

- 2. May a pharmacist lawfully be employed by a dispensary? There is no statute or rule that specifically allows or precludes a pharmacist working for a medical cannabis dispensary. However, to be a certified dispenser one must comply with the provisions of 583-X-8-.03.
- 3. May a pharmacist lawfully own a dispensary of medical cannabis? There is no statute or rule that would preclude a pharmacist from owning a dispensary.
- 4. May a pharmacist/technician/intern/extern practice while under the care of a physician while taking medical cannabis? Currently, federal law stipulates cannabis as a Schedule I, while the state of Alabama has

provided specific regulations around medical cannabis. The Board will review situations surrounding pharmacists utilizing medical cannabis under a doctor's care as presented and/or necessary.
