**1. INVOCATION**

An invocation was given by Mr. Brooklere.

**2. MOTIONS**

A motion was made by Ms. Giles and seconded by Mr. Brooklere to approve the February 10, 2026, hearing minutes. A vote was taken and the motion to approve the February 10, 2026, hearing minutes passed with aye votes from Dr. Cobb, Ms. Giles, Mr. Brooklere, Dr. Hicks, Dr. Marbury, Dr. Mitchell, Ms. Booker, and Dr. Pinner. Judge Stokes abstained. No nays

recorded.

**3. DISCIPLINARY CASES**

Disciplinary case number 23-0255 was heard by the Board beginning at 8:53 a.m. and concluding at 9:56 a.m.

**4. EXECUTIVE SESSION**

A motion was made by Mr. Brooklere and seconded by Ms. Giles to enter executive session for the purpose of the nine Board members to deliberate on the disciplinary case that had been heard. Mr. Dettling confirmed that deliberation is an appropriate purpose for executive session. An individual voice vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously. No nays or abstentions recorded. The executive session will begin at 10:05 a.m., with the Board scheduled to return to the public hearing at 10:20 a.m. The hearing recessed at 9:57 a.m. and resumed at 10:59 a.m.

**5. RECESS**

A recess was taken from 11:00 a.m. to 11:15 a.m.

**6. EXECUTIVE SESSION**

A motion was then made by Ms. Giles and seconded by Mr. Brooklere to enter executive session for the purpose of the nine Board members, Mr. Dettling, Mr. Linna, and Mr. Shaw to review a pending cases and litigation. Mr. Dettling certified that the purpose for executive session is to review pending cases and litigation and discuss information related to the good name and character of individuals who have yet to be charged with a disciplinary matter and whose names are confidential. An individual voice vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously. No nays or abstentions recorded. The executive session will begin at 11:20 a.m., with the Board scheduled to return to the public hearing at 11:40 a.m. The hearing recessed at 11:16 a.m. and resumed at 12:22 p.m.

**7. DISCUSSION**

A discussion was held regarding a settlement offer on case 22-F-0004. A motion was made by Ms. Giles and seconded by Mr. Brooklere to instruct Mr. Dettling and Mr. Linna to work on a counterproposal to be presented at a future Board meeting. A vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously. Nay nays or abstentions recorded.

**8. MOTIONS ON CASES**

A motion was made by Dr. Hicks and seconded by Ms. Giles in case numbers 26-0008, 26-0009, 25-0303, and 25-0310 to issue a letter of concern. A vote was taken and the motion to issue a letter of concern passed unanimously. No nays or abstentions recorded.

A motion was made by Dr. Hicks and seconded by Ms. Giles in case numbers 25-0309, 25-0302, 26-0012, 25-0320, and 25-0257 to issue a letter of concern and corrective action plan. A vote was taken and the motion to issue a letter of concern and corrective action plan passed unanimously. No nays or abstentions recorded.

A motion was made by Dr. Hicks and seconded by Ms. Giles in case numbers 26-0003, 26-0007, 26-0013, 25-0294, 25-0076, 25-0307, 25-0308, 25-0313, and 25-0321 for no violation. A vote

was taken and the motion for no violation passed unanimously. No nays or abstentions recorded.

A motion was made by Dr. Hicks and seconded by Ms. Giles in case numbers 26-0014, 26-0004, and 26-0006 for no further action. A vote was taken and the motion for no further action passed unanimously. No nays or abstentions recorded.

A motion was made by Dr. Hicks and seconded by Ms. Giles in case number 24-0250 to refer to FDA, refer to the attorney general's office, and refer to the home state. A vote was taken and the motion to refer to FDA, refer to the attorney general's office, and refer to the home state passed unanimously. No nays or abstentions recorded.

A motion was made by Dr. Hicks and seconded by Ms. Giles in case number 26-0017 to accept a surrender and initiate an investigation of the pharmacies. A vote was taken and the motion to accept a surrender and initiate an investigation of the pharmacies passed unanimously. No nays or abstentions recorded.

Mr. Dettling confirmed that deliberating is an appropriate purpose for executive session. An individual voice vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously. No nays or abstentions recorded. The executive session will begin at 3:05 p.m., with the Board scheduled to return to the public hearing at 3:35 p.m. The hearing recessed at 2:58 p.m. and resumed at 3:38 p.m.

**12. MOTIONS ON APPLICANT APPEARANCES**

A motion was made by Dr. Hicks and seconded by Ms. Giles in case number 26-0068 to grant the technician registration with no hearing necessary for an intern/extern permit. A vote was taken and the motion to grant the technician registration with no hearing necessary for an intern/expert permit passed with aye votes from Ms. Giles, Mr. Brooklere, Dr. Hicks, Dr. Marbury, Dr. Mitchell, Ms. Booker, and Dr. Pinner. Judge Stokes recused himself and abstained from the vote. Dr. Cobb abstained. No nays recorded.

A motion was made by Dr. Hicks and seconded by Ms. Giles in case number 26-0058 to grant the technician registration. A vote was taken and the motion to grant the technician registration passed with aye votes from Ms. Giles, Mr. Brooklere, Dr. Hicks, Dr. Marbury, Dr. Mitchell, Ms. Booker, and Dr. Pinner. Dr. Cobb voted no. No abstentions recorded.

A motion was made by Dr. Hicks and seconded by Ms. Giles in case number 26-0067 to deny the virtual request. A vote was taken and the motion to deny the virtual request passed unanimously. No nays or abstentions recorded.


In case number 26-0025, the technician registration applicant withdrew the application.
